Introduction

Conversations about Faith & Life (CFL) are weekly interactive devotions about Jesus that equip Christians to live out their faith in daily life.

CFL creates an environment where God can nurture faith through His Word. At the same time, CFL creates a safe space for Christ-followers to learn through experience. Repeatedly reciting God's Word, articulating our faith or praying aloud prepares us to do the same with family, friends or acquaintances.

The key to CFL is the devotions are participative.

In groups, a different person should read the passage out loud each week. Those who do these devotions alone are asked to read the passages aloud.

Each devotion has three questions about the Bible passage. In groups, each person is encouraged to respond to the questions. Individuals should consider journaling answers.

The devotions close with prayer. In groups, each person is asked to share a petition. When the group starts praying, each person offers another participant's petition. Solo participants should pray aloud in response to the devotion.

How to Use CFL

There are two ways of accessing the weekly devotions.

Anyone with a smart phone, tablet or computer can access the devotions starting Sunday morning each week on KevinWilson360.org. The devotions are found on the home page as a featured blog post all week.

You also can download all the devotions for the 2017-2018 Church Year as a PDF document on the Resources page on KevinWilson360.org. The document is free. There is a bonus if you worship in a Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregation, since the Scripture passages mirror the three-year cycle of the LCMS lectionary.

Symbols of Jesus

The Week of December 3, 2017 + The 1st Sunday in Advent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below passage describes Jesus entering the holy city of Jerusalem. There is a certain irony to the praise and honor Jesus receives, since Jesus has already predicted his death and resurrection.

Reading from the Gospel

Mark 11: 1 Now when they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples 2 and said to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it. 3 If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." 4 And they went away and found a colt tied at a door outside in the street, and they untied it. 5 And some of those standing there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" 6 And they told them what Jesus had said, and they let them go. 7 And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it, and he sat on it. 8 And many spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. 9 And those who went before and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! 10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!" (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

How is Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem ironic? For background, read Luke 9:22 and 18:31-33.

Throwing cloaks on the ground before Jesus was a symbol that Jesus is royalty. What symbols of Jesus are found in your church building? What are found in your home?

Share about an especially memorable experience of praising God.

The Week of December 10, 2017 + The 2nd Sunday in Advent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below passage is the start of the account of Jesus life and ministry from the Gospel of Mark.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 1: 1 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 2 As it is written in Isaiah the prophet,

"Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, **3** the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'"

4 John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. **5** And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. **6** Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. **7** And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. **8** I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (ESV)

The Week of December 17, 2017 + The 3rd Sunday in Advent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below passage provides insight into John the Baptizer, a prophet called by God to prepare people for Jesus.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 1:19 And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" 20 He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." 21 And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." 22 So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" 23 He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said." (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

Why were the religious leaders interested in John the Baptizer's identify?

In what ways has God defined your identity? For insights, consider Romans 6:3-4, 2 Corinthians 5:7 or 1 Peter 2:9.

The Week of December 24, 2017 + The 4th Sunday in Advent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below passage tells one of the stories within the narrative of Jesus' birth.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Luke 1:26 In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, 27 to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. 28 And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" 29 But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. 30 And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." (ESV)

Presentation of Jesus

The Week of December 31, 2017 + The 1st Sunday after Christmas

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below event occurs when Jesus, soon after birth, was presented to God at the temple in Jerusalem.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Luke 2:25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. 26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, 28 he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

29 "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; 30 for my eyes have seen your salvation 31 that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, 32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." (ESV)

The Week of January 7, 2017 + The Baptism of Our Lord

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account describes how John the Baptizer prepared the way for Jesus.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 1:4 John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. 5 And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. 7 And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. 8 I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

What about John gave him credibility as a prophet?

Discuss the distinctions between John's baptism and Jesus' baptism.

Considering verse 7, share about someone you know of who lives with humility similar to John the Baptizer.

The Week of January 14 + The 2nd Sunday after the Epiphany

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account provides a picture of how Jesus called disciples.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 1: 43 The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." 46 Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." 47 Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" 48 Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." 49 Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" 50 Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." 51 And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man." (ESV)

Fishers of Men

The Week of January 21 + The 3rd Sunday after the Epiphany

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs soon after Jesus announced his teaching and preaching ministry.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 1:16 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. 17 And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." 18 And immediately they left their nets and followed him. 19 And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him. (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

What do you find interesting about the men Jesus called as disciples?

Fishermen used large nets for fishing in Jesus' day. How does the image of casting a large net impact your understanding of verse 17?

Share about a time you "followed" Jesus by emulating Jesus.

Amazed at Jesus

The Week of January 28 + The 4th Sunday after the Epiphany

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The city named in this passage, Capernaum, became a center for Jesus' ministry.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 1:21 And they went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching. 22 And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. 23 And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, 24 "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God." 25 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" 26 And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. 27 And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." 28 And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee. (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

How did Jesus' teaching and healing ministry benefit Jesus? In what way is Jesus teaching still authoritative today? How does Jesus amaze you?

Pray for One Another

Demons

The Week of February 4 + The 5th Sunday after the Epiphany

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The men listed in this passage were close followers of Jesus. As such, their families would welcome Jesus into their homes.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 1: 29 And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. 30 Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. 31 And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

32 That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons. **33** And the whole city was gathered together at the door. **34** And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him. (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

How could the demons know Jesus?

What do you think of exorcisms performed today?

Brainstorm different ways we can bring comfort from God to people who are suffering.

Pray for One Another

Transfiguration

The Week of February 11 + The Transfiguration of Our Lord

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs near the end of Jesus' preaching and teaching ministry and close to his final entrance into Jerusalem.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 9:2 And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, 3 and his clothes became radiant, intensely white, as no one on earth could bleach them. 4 And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. 5 And Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." 6 For he did not know what to say, for they were terrified. 7 And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." 8 And suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only. (ESV)

Sharing your Faith

Compare Jesus' "transfiguration" and our "transformation." See Romans 12:2, 2 Corinthians 3:18 for background information.

Why do you listen to Jesus (verse 7)?

Share about a time you were afraid or terrified, yet were ultimately comforted by God.

Pray for One Another

Temptation

The Week of February 18 + The 1st Sunday in Lent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs right after Jesus' baptism and just before Jesus starts his public teaching ministry.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Matthew 4:1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. **2** And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. **3** And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." **4** But he answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

5 Then the devil took him to the holy city and set him on the pinnacle of the temple **6** and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down, for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone."

7 Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.'" **8** Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. **9** And he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." **10** Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve."

11 Then the devil left him, and behold, angels came and were ministering to him. (ESV)

Which of Satan's temptations do you find the most challenging?

Who ministers to you when you've faced difficult, even exhausting times?

Christ

The Week of February 25 + The 2nd Sunday in Lent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below exchange occurs when Jesus is facing escalating opposition as a religious teacher and prophet.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 8:27 And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" 28 And they told him, "John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." 29 And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." 30 And he strictly charged them to tell no one about him.

Sharing your Faith

Why were people confusing Jesus with "John the Baptist" or "Elijah"?

Who do people say Jesus is today?

Jesus instructs the disciples, at least for the moment, not to reveal his identify to others. How can we discern when to talk with people about Jesus and when to hold off?

Pray for One Another

Righteous Anger

The Week of March 4 + The 3rd Sunday in Lent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

John records this story early in his Gospel to demonstrate that Jesus was sent by God the Father. The proof is found in Jesus fulfilling Old Testament prophecies.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 2:13 The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. 14 In the temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. 15 And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. 16 And he told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade." 17 His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me."

Sharing your Faith

What captures your imagination about this account?

Jesus exhibited righteous "indignation" or "anger" without sinning. Discuss how you deal with emotionally charged situations as Christians.

Share about a time you were especially zealous for God.

Popular Bible Passages

The Week of March 11 + The 4th Sunday in Lent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below teaching of Jesus is part of an exchange with a Jewish leader named Nicodemus.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. **17** For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. **18** Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God."

Sharing your Faith

What is revealed about God the Father in this passage?

Why do you think John 3:18 isn't nearly as universally known as John 3:16?

Share other well-known Bible passages or stories and why those passages are so popular.

Servant and Slave

The Week of March 18 + The 5th Sunday in Lent

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below teaching occurs after two disciples, James and John, asked for special places of honor among Jesus' followers.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Mark 10:41 And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. 42 And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. 43 But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Sharing your Faith

What words does Jesus use to describe his followers?

How did Jesus model this teaching?

Share about an experience where someone was gracious or humble towards you.

Pray for One Another

Triumphant Entry

The Week of March 25 + Palm Sunday

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs as Jesus is entering Jerusalem for the final time.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 12:12 The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. **13** So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" **14** And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

15 "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

Sharing your Faith

What is the implication of the crowd crying out, "...even the King of Israel"?

The palm branches were brought as symbols of Jesus' royalty. How do we demonstrate Jesus is our Lord and King today?

Share about an experience where you were especially in awe of God.

Pray for One Another

Resurrection!

The Week of April 1 + The Resurrection of our Lord

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The following occurs after Jesus' horrific death and subsequent burial.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 20:1 Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. 2 So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." 3 So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. 4 Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. 5 And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, 7 and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. 8 Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; 9 for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. 10 Then the disciples went back to their homes.

Sharing your Faith

What strikes you about the above account?

Who are you most like when it comes to matters of faith? Peter, who bursts into the tomb? Or "the other disciple," who hesitates before entering the tomb.

What are you looking forward to the most when Jesus returns to raise the living and the dead?

Pray for One Another

Jesus and Thomas

The Week of April 8 + The 2nd Sunday of Easter

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs soon after Jesus was raised from the dead, but there was still a good deal of confusion about what had happened to Jesus.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 20:24 Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." 26 Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." 28 Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" 29 Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Sharing your Faith

What did Thomas say it would take for him to trust Jesus was resurrected? How did Jesus exceed these requirements?

What do you find as affirming or encouraging about this passage?

Share about a time God sustained you through a season of doubt.

Pray for One Another

Witnesses

The Week of April 15 + The 3rd Sunday of Easter

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below account occurs after Jesus' resurrection. He is addressing his disciples after miraculously appearing to them.

Excerpt from the Gospel

Luke 24:44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, 47 and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

Sharing your Faith

What did the disciples witness? (verse 48)

In what ways did Jesus fulfill what was written in the "Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms"? (Verse 44) Examples are found in Isaiah 9:1-7 and Isaiah chapter 53.

Share about a time when you had an "aha" moment in understanding a Scripture passage.

Pray for One Another

The Good Shepherd

The Week of April 22 + The 4th Sunday of Easter

The Narrative of Jesus' Life

The below teaching occurs after Jesus started to face opposition to his public ministry from religious leaders.

Excerpt from the Gospel

John 10:11 (Jesus said,) "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 12 He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. 13 He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. 14 I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, 15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. 16 And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. 17 For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. 18 No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father." (ESV)

John 15:1 (Jesus said,) "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. 2 Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. 3 Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. 4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. 7 If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples.

I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. 13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. 14 I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 15 I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. 16 They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. 18 As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth."

John 3:1 Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. 2 This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." 3 Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." 4 Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" 5 Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. 6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' 8 The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Mark 2:23 One Sabbath he was going through the grainfields, and as they made their way, his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. 24 And the Pharisees were saying to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?" 25 And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did, when he was in need and was hungry, he and those who were with him: 26 how he entered the house of God, in the time of Abiathar the high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and also gave it to those who were with him?" 27 And he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. 28 So the Son of Man is lord even of the Sabbath." (ESV)

(ESV)

28 and brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother. (ESV)

But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God! 25 It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." 26 And they were exceedingly astonished, and said to him, "Then who can be saved?" 27 Jesus looked at them and said, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God." (ESV)

Mark 13:24 "But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, 25 and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. 26 And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. 27 And then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. 28 From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts out its leaves, you know that summer is near. 29 So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. 30 Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. 31 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." (ESV)
